CANNERY READY FOR USE

All canning will be done in tin cans.

A supervisor will be present to give instruction in the use of equipment. A fee of five cents will cover all cost for No. 2 cans and seven cents for No. 3 cans. Approximately 600 cans may be put up in a 10 hour day. The building will be open enough days per week to meet

the demands.

Anyone in the Bailey area may use the community cannery located on the Bailey school ground.

Operation will be under the supervision of the Home Economics and Agriculture departments. Persons who use the cannery will furnish their own labor for preparation and processing.

Tools were made as new by the ninth grade Agriculture boys the third week in March.

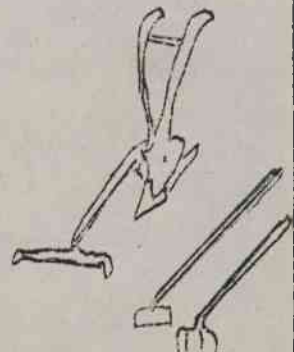
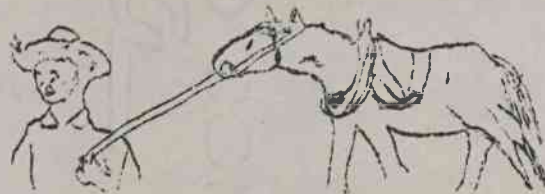
They cleaned the tools with oil and rust-remover-saws, chisels, planes, squares, power machinery, and other metal machinery were oiled.
