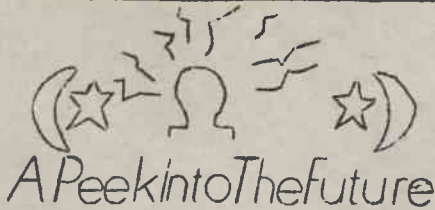


Why I Like Bailey
