

Bugle Demands Hours  
Of Work In Publication

Hours of planning, checking, typing, cutting on mimeoscope, and mimeographing are spent in the publishing of the BUGLE each month.

Performing the various duties assigned requires ingenuity, muscle control, discerning ability, and a "nose for news".

## WRITING PREREQUISITES

After class instructions in the principles of journalism and discussions of items for news, features, and editorials, each person chooses his subjects and writes them according to specified rules, necessitating writing and re-writing several times in order to meet the requirements of journalism and to be ready for typing. When the typing has been done, each article must be checked for errors and spacings marked to form even columns.

Ads are designed by the staff and transferred to a stencil by the mimeoscope workers.

## DUMMY

In the spare time, after all ads have been secured, a dummy, one-fourth the size of the Bugle, is planned as a pattern for the make-up of the paper. Later, regular sized dummy sheets are marked off and used when arranging the layout. This step requires considerable thinking and reworking of articles to make them fit the space allotted.
