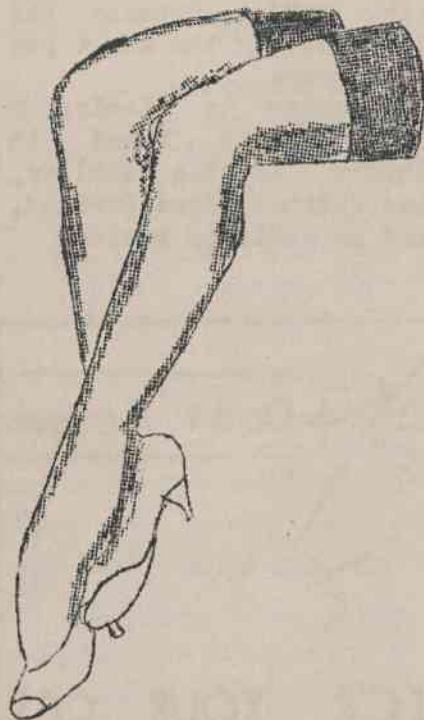


# Alumni Attend College; Receive Honors
