pace; for, far worse than the longest, most awkward pause is the tongue which, without a thought to urge it, rattles ceaselessly."

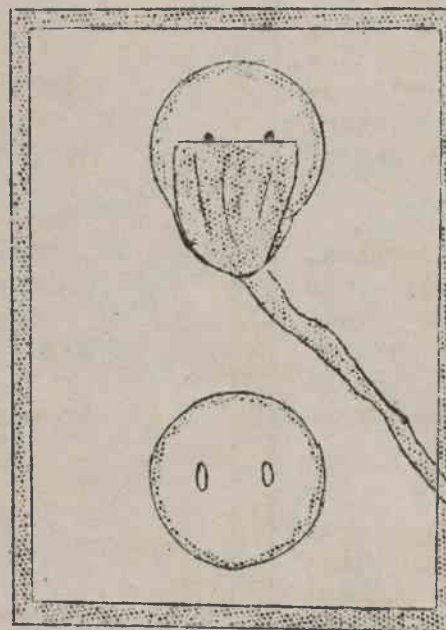
5. Is slang ever permissible?
