Lester Bissette, wearing for the first time a red shirt and black satin jacket topped with a Chinese dragon in color, caused quite a bit of commotion in the halls.

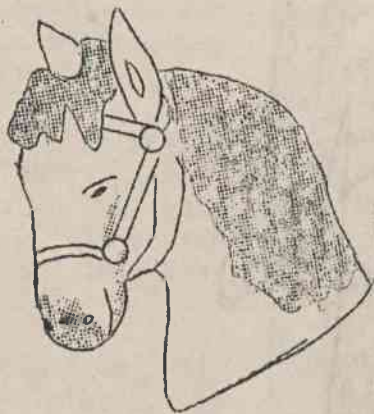
A glitter and a gleam is every girl since Christmas as she sports new jewelry, especially new watches and bracelets.
