Above is a facsimile of the pin.

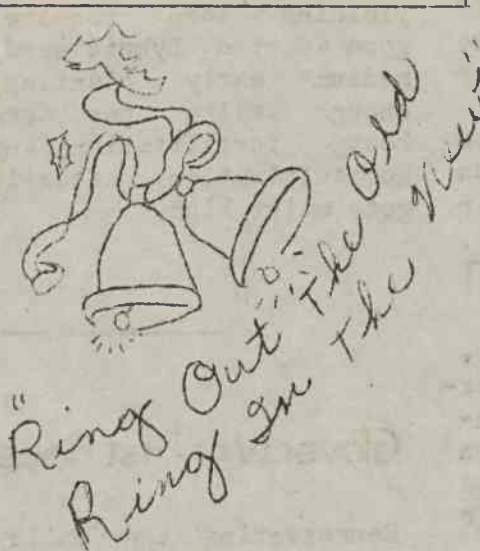
## Paper Shortage Hits Bugle
