PECAN CRISPIES

1/2 cup shortening 1/2 cup butter 2 1/2 cup brown sugar 2 beaten eggs 2 1/2 cups flour 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon soda 1 cup chopped peran meat

Thoroughly cream shortening and sugar; add eggs and beat well. Add sifted dry ingredients, then nut meats. Drop from teaspoon about 2 inches apart onto greased cooky sheet. Bake in moderate oven (350°) 12 to 15 minutes. Make 5 dozen cookies.
