The home economics department has added bulletins and furnishings concerning housekeeping and other home economics studies.

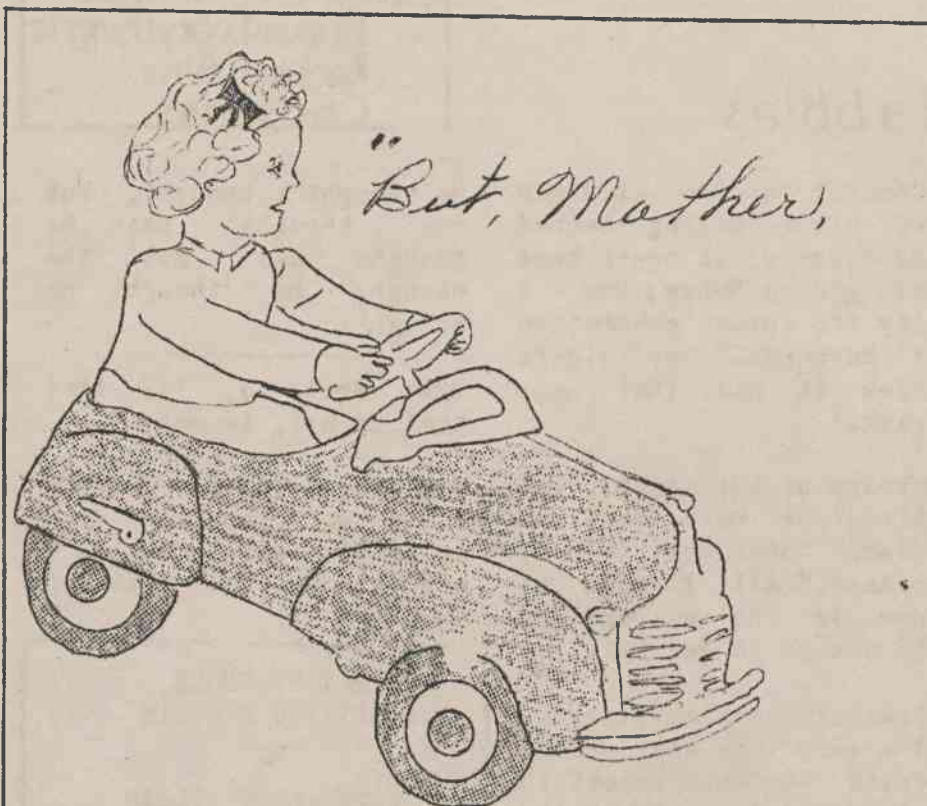
In the library a beautiful arrangement of book covers is displayed on the bulletin board.
