After answering the letter, Madge received another stating: "I lose three

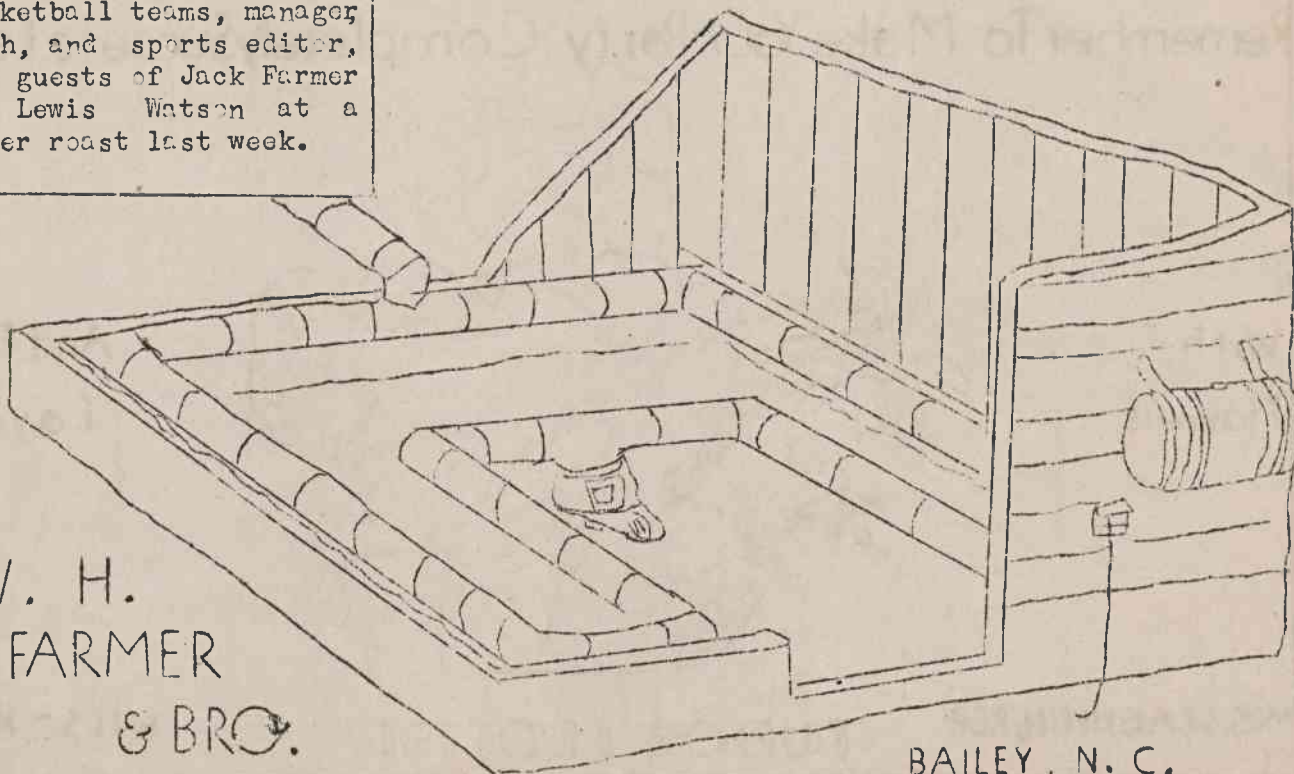
Pete Stone, senior, and Tommy Perry, sophomore, scoring a home run apiece, lead the baseball team to victory in the Wakelon game 9-4.
