Nore adequate equipment is the factor determining the choice of furnishings for the soon-to-be-completed rooms.
Equipment for the two primary grade rooms will consist of blackboards,essentials needed for library corners, lavatories, and teachers' cabinets.
In addition to plenty of blackboard and bulletin board space, there will be in the English room movable desks, storage cabinets, and a work table extending the length of the rear of the room.
The library, composed of one of the new rooms and the library book stack room, to be located in the space now occupied by the top of the present stairway, will be a combination study hall, reading room, and magazine display room.
