Staff Explains First Place Rating

What does first place rating of a school paper signify? As this is a question asked by the public from time to time, the staff will undertake to clarify the term.

Papers of all schools of the United States are grouped according to the high school enrollment and the type of paper published.

As a result of this grouping arrangement, the Bugle competes with papers from senior high schools enrolling as many as 300 students. This is almost double the enrollment of BHS.

Each issue of the paper from April through January is sent to Columbia University, where all phases of the paper—the make-up, typing, English features, advertisements, news, titles, and leads—are judged.

If any paper exceeds 850 points out of a possible 1000, it receives a first class rating in the group with which it is placed.

During the first two years of publication Mildred Ruffin, '38, Mr. Walker's secretary, typed the stencils. When Mrs. Laurine Lassiter, commercial teacher, began teaching at BHS in '41, her department assumed this responsibility.

The first year's editions were much smaller than the present copies and were mimeographed in two columns on only one side of the page.

During the nine years of publication the BUGLE has failed only once to meet its deadline. This delay was caused by the senior pictures failing to arrive from the engraver on time.
