Students Need Inventory For New Year

Have you taken inventory yet for last year, students? If not, do it right away. If you have, what did you find? Profit or loss? As you look back over the year and begin to check up, in all probability there are things you would change if you had that power. There are those things which were done which should have been left undone; and oh, so many things neglected which should have taken

first place. An inventory is a valuable tool. It lets us know just where we stand.

Have you mapped your course for the new year? Aimless drifting gets one nowhere. Set your sights and sail a straight course. What improvements, as a student, can you make?
