A few moments and we were severed. No tears were shed, but there was a brief period of regret.

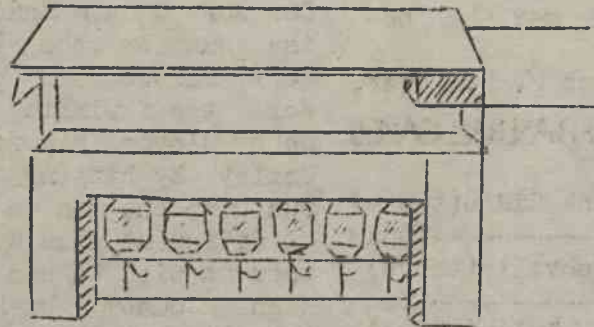
Out among friends, I was greeted with ooh's, ahs, second glances, and "Is that really you?"
