This year's basketball teams were not recorded as high in the schedule as they have been before. Bailey boys won a total of 15 games and lost 13; the girls won 17, lost 8. These numbers include county and unscheduled games.

The total income for the year's basketball was much less than last year. This year only \$789.70 was received. \$710.70 of this was taken in at the door of the Bailey gymnasium. \$79 was received from the Nash County tournament.

This money was used for referees, gymnasium expenses, guarantees to visiting teams, suits, balls, and the financing of the baseball team, since they have no income.

The boys' baseball team opened its first game of the season in Bailey by losing to Spring Hope 6 to 2. L. G. Deans and Leslie Dew served as moundsmen of the game for the locals. Carl Barbee was pitcher for the winning team. Bobby Glover starred for Bailey by hitting a home run with one man on base.

A different plan has been thought wise to use in the Nash County basketball tournament next year. The top seeded team will be required to play in games other than the finals.

Bailey lost to the Stantonsburg baseball team 9 to 4. This was the third lost of the season.
