Methodist Meeting Ground Proves Interesting

On my recent trip to the mountains one of the stops made was the Ball Creek Camp Meeting ground. Located west of Catawba, North Carolina, it was begun by the Methodists in 1853 and yearly revival services in camp meeting style have been held here every year since, except two years,

In 1853 the first sermon was preached at Ball Creck. At this time there were only ten or twelve tents. People who didn't have tents took shelter under brush.

Over four-hundred-numbered tents, built in four rows around a central arbor, form a blockade effect, shutting out all out side interferences.

The tents are in reality small crude buildings, usually consisting of two rooms and a loft with the ground as a floor, resembling the cow and horse stables of today. One room is used for cooking and eating purposes, while the other one and the loft have bunks for sleeping.

During the revival week entire families 'move out, baggage and all, to spend the week camping. Today concession stands are found around the outer rim of the circle.
