#### Lunchroom In The Clear

To date the lunchroom is holding its head clear of debts.

If it were not for the contributions of the federal government, the out-of-debt state of the lunchroom would not be possible. The government has donated \$1838.05 in money and \$1116.78 in commodities.

Averaging feeding 279 students a day, the lunchroom has taken in \$7535.66 and paid out \$6705.50. The difference will be spent on light bills, water bills, and other expenditures.

The menu of the lunchroom usually consists of two vegetables and a meat, a fruit or dessert, bread, milk, peanut butter, and creamery butter. Twice a week ice cream is served.
