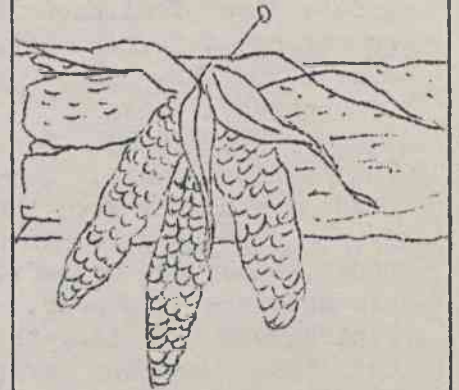

Just the other day a high school student was seen copying the addresses of the banquet guests.

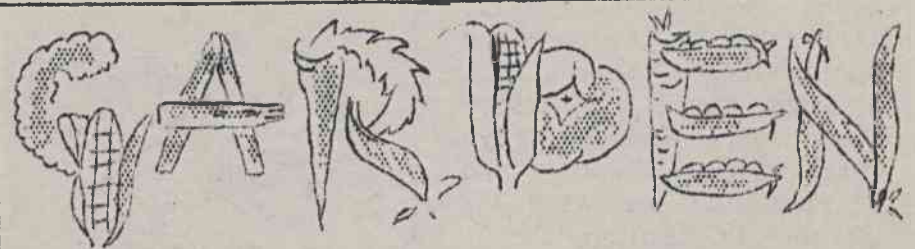
All in all, the seniors are beginning to believe
