### MAPS

Intensive study of North Carolina through the use of maps was made recently by the class. After a general survey the class charted on a map of North Carolina the rainfall, elevation, surface division, minerals, and industrial workers of each county.

Through informed study; the pupils colored their maps, designed and made their covers, typed general information on North Carolina as a whole, and compiled their work into a book on North Carolina.

Mrs. Laurine T. Lassiter's tenth grade home room has a radio.

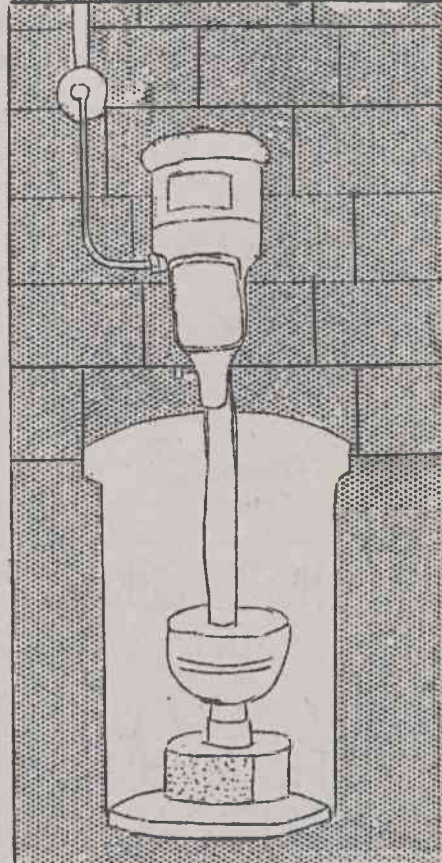
## Next To Bus, Walking Holds First Place With Students
