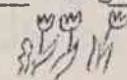




# Juniors Entertain Seniors In An Old Dutch Garden

### DECORATIONS

The table was a scene of many Dutch colors. Candle holders came from blue Dutch sailboats with white sails. Between the candles were logs with tulips growing from them. Center pieces were miniature Dutch villages in which were found cottages, windmills, sailboats, Dutch figures representing different vocations of Holland, and a stream with live gold fish. Nut cups were small wooden shoes.

### PROGRAM

The program opened with the entire group singing "When You Wore A Tulip". After the invocation by


### GUESTS
