- (3) Lighting (a county project if done).

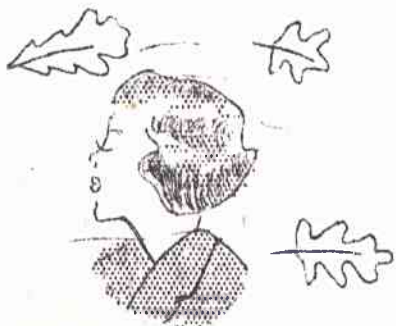
Both Elementary School and High School were continued

Twenty-five or thirty school children assist fellow student, Carroll Jones, with cotton picking. The students are to be "praised" for picking the cotton so clean, Mr. Jones, Carroll's father, remarked. From five and a half acres there were 6800 pounds of seed cotton picked within two weeks. (2) Good education must be a growing, changing, and dynamic process. (3) Good education is spiritual in nature. Each of the above is a good foundation upon which to build.

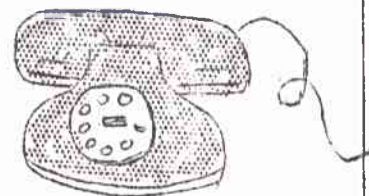
