Seniors Endeavoring To Buy Public Address System

P.T.A. Treasury Surges Up As Result Of Carnival

Music Dept. Turns Former Gr. Room Into Use

All public school music classes are now meeting in their new quarters, the room formerly known as the seventh grade room.

The use of this room will offset this drawback of rattling pots and pans in the lunchroom. Because of the large open space of the auditorium, it is hard for Miss Lawrence to conduct her choral work there.

At the last Parent-Teacher meeting, the association voted to match a county \$25 allotment for purchasing records for use in Miss Lawrence's department.

Theater Model Needed

In an attempt to purchase a public address system for the auditorium, the seniors have contacted two companies.

The first one, the Carolina School Service, has done work on the school's present sound system. This company did not have the amplifiers that were needed, but it did suggest to the class the type required.

The second company, called in from Raleigh, gave a demonstration on November 1 during dress rehearsal for the senior play. It was soon discovered that this type, because of the smallness of the auditorium, gave a rebound or echo, which proved this system to be unsatisfactory.

TYPE REQUIRED

The type needed is similar to the ones used in theaters with amplifiers, or units, that fit on each side of the wall. Such a system would make the sound uniform throughout the room. The cost would be approximately \$350.

The seniors next contacted Clifton Britton, dramatics instructor of Goldsboro High School, who has the type of address system desired. He will be able to advise the class as to purchase, type, and cost.
