FLARED JACKET

Flaring a little off the hips to give a "padded" effect, the bottom of the jacket is bound as the sleeves.

Other such suits can be found in velvet and cotton combinations with bindings and insertions of gold threads, iridescent taffeta, wine and black velvet, and wools with pique trim.

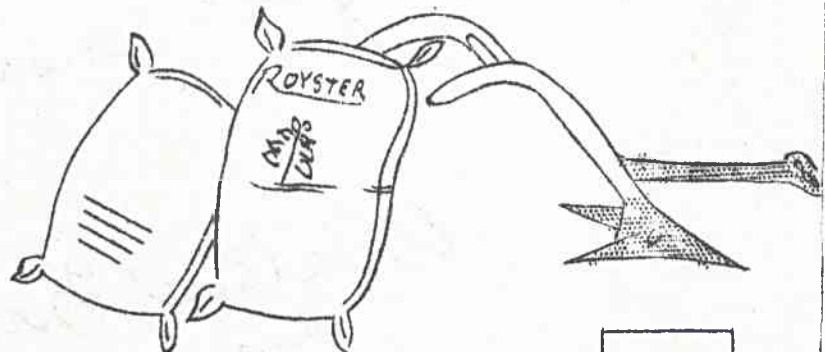
Class Designs Table

Using rulers, compasses, knowledge, and skill, the geometry class of 12 pupils is applying geometric arts to Miss Edith Farmer's card table.

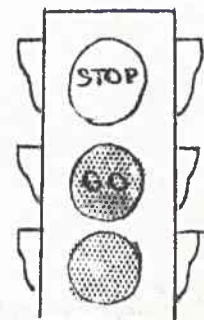
This table will be the class's exhibit at Open House in March.

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
