"The boys are cooperating fine and we are grateful for the work being done", states Mr. Weaver.

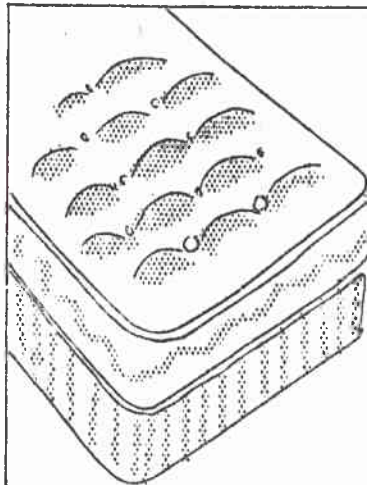
Pace Wins Top Honors in Corn Contest
