If a student leaves Bailey and enters another school, he or she is none the worse off. The dropouts are the ones who will suffer for it.


The North Carolina Public School Bulletin has some pertinent information and least one remedy for the situation.

What ever reasons there are for these dropouts. there is need to find out. the exact reasons in each case. No teacher has time to look into all these cases. Attendance officers who can do the job need to be hired. Let's hope the next General Assembly will put attendance officers each administrative unit in the state.
