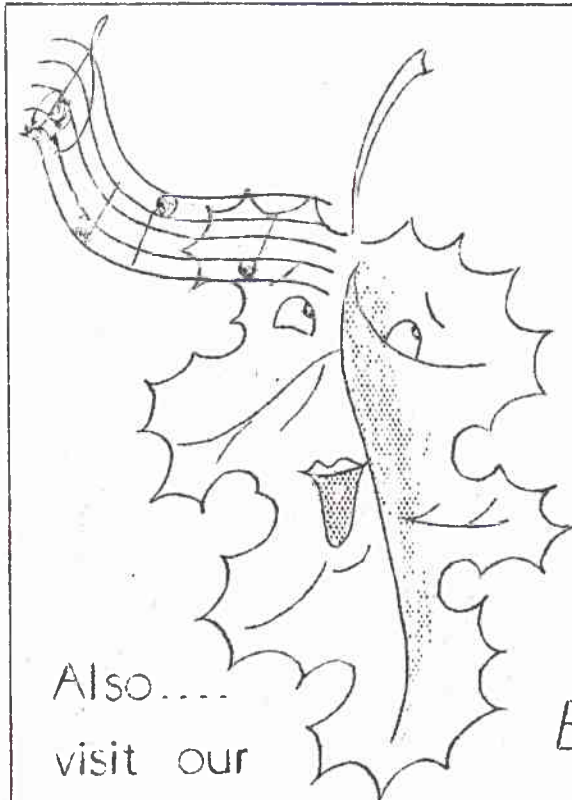
Music Teacher Reveals Grading Basis
