

2 de C. sugar C. cold water 1 C. nuts o white syrup 1.tsp. vanilla 2 egg whites Method: Combine syrup, and cold water in pan. Mix and put on stove and stir until it boils. Test frequently by dropping a small amount in cold water. As soon as it will form a soft ball in cold water, pour 14 Tbsp. slowly over stiffly beaten egg whites, stirring or beating constantly. Put the remaining mixture back on stove and cook until it forms a hard ball in water. Pour slowly over the egg white mixture, beat until it creams, add vanilla and nuts. Drop by spoonfulls on the waxed paper.
