Town Soon To Have New Supply of Water

"Clearer water" is the expectation of each Bailey citizen as the new 155 ft. drilled well nears completion. Costing \$1,115, this well, adjacent to the town's water tank, will give Bailey a water supply with a minimum iron-content, says town clerk, Miss Faye Finch.

It is hoped that since the new well is not as deep as the present one, the water will not contain too much iron element.

A water supply with a minimum iron-content will aid the lunchroom helpers in keeping the new equipment and dish cloths free of stains. The same can be said of the Bailey homes.
