H.S. Enrollment Exceeds All Previous Records

"The high school enrollment is the highest it has ever been, but the elementary school is 14 students lower than that of last year", was the announcement made by Principal M. W. Weaver at this month's PTA meeting.

Enrolled in school are 586 students, 205 of whom are in high school. The remaining 381 are in grades one through eight.

LAST YEAR'S RECORD

In comparison with the 190 registering in high school last year this means a gain of 15 students and a loss of 14 from the 395 enrolling in elementary school.

According to Principal Weaver, there are two or three high school students that should come in, but the only prospects for additional elementary school students will be those moving into the community.
