Jackson and Nash Streets; another, on Pine Street.

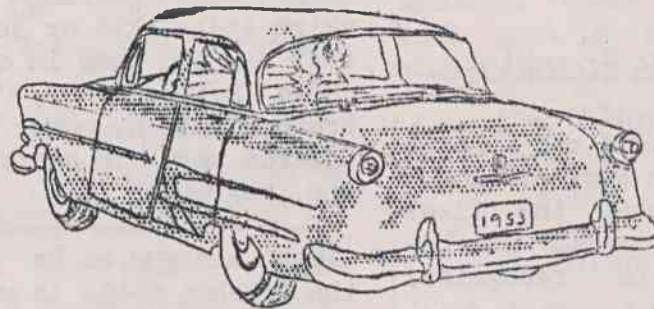
Each stop light cost 483.68.
