

Staff Plans New York Trip

Thursday evening's entertainment is the musical comedy, WONDERFUL TOWN, starring Rosalind Russell; Friday evening's, "the only Cinerama."

Early Saturday morning, if the Bugle has been criticized, a visit to the Statue of Liberty and the Empire State or a comparable building will be made.

At noon in the Grand Ballroom at Waldorf Astoria Hotel will be staged a banquet honoring all students.

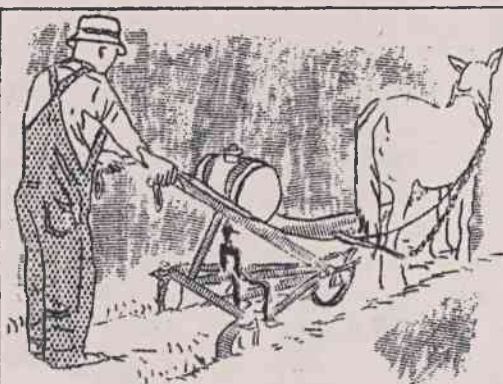
With part of Saturday afternoon free the group will be taken down town to see the stores, and shop if they wish. Their last night's entertainment will be a visit to Radio City.
