Bear these facts in mind when you approach the man or woman on the other side of the desk!

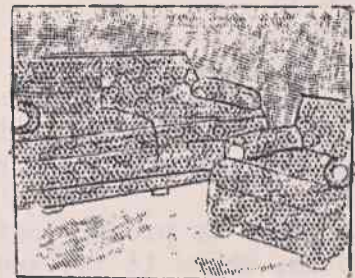
