## Turkish President Receives Here Warm Welcome From Large Crowd

As President Celal Bayar and Madame Bayar and party arrived in Bailey, a deafening cheer rising from the throats of enthusiastic school children and adults, waving Turkish and United States flags, proclaimed a welcome that led one Press Association man accompanying the visiting party throughout their tour of the country to affirm that "the President has received here the most heart-warming, spontaneous reception given him on his tour of the United States. The patrol-escorted visitors, entering the circular driveway leading to the school building, drove be-

tween Turkish and American flags spaced at intervals along the drive.

Congressman Harold Cooley and Mayor Mike Griffin greeted President and Madame Bayar as they stepped from their car and escorted them, along with other Turkish and American dignitaries, through the home economics department, the cafeteria, and the lower floor of the main building. Students lined along the roped-off walk received from the President, an ex-school teacher, and Madame Bayar, as they walked down the steps, handshakes, pats on the head, or assistance in the waving of flags--an act not on the program (See PRESIDENT page 2)
