School Stands To Gain Added H.S. Teacher

If the 211 students enrolled in high school will attend school regularly enough to average 200 students present each day, the high school will have an additional teacher next year, Principal M. W. Weaver points out.

In discussing this possibility of an extra teacher, Principal Weaver listed a number of advantages the students will gain:

1. It could free the principal from teaching classes and give him time to do what he needs to do.

2. It would relieve the past-time librarian from study hall duties.

3. The extra teacher would give pupils additional courses.

4. It would enable oversize classes to be divided. By having smaller classes the teacher could give more attention to the weaker students and thereby reduce failures.

Weaver said that the State would determine the 200-average attendance on the best consecutive six out of first seven months of the school year.


He further stressed the fact that it was to the students interest to be at school every day.


