Lived a greedy little boy who couldn't get still.

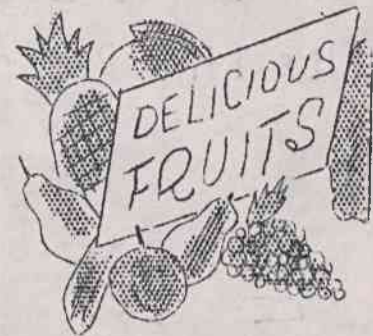
He was hoping that he would get toys galore.

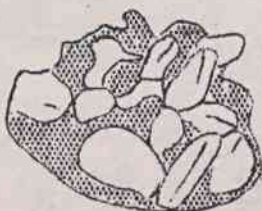
