

# Seniors Model Small Bookcases

A short summary of the story is written inside the bookjacket, while the title, author's name, and the type of book is printed on the outside.

Some seniors have adorned their bookcases and are designing and making bookends.

Mrs. L. T. Lassiter and Mrs. Howard Farmer, advisors for the Bugle, have been asked by Earl Whitbeck, Chairman Duplicate Division, Columbia Scholastic Press Association, to help with the grading of the mimeograph papers.

"I know from watching your publications for several years that you are capable of doing the job for me," wrote Whitbeck.

Mrs. Lassiter and Mrs. Farmer will be sent a scorebook for each school paper, which they will follow in grading the papers.

The scorebook contains four big topics: Content, Writing and Editing, Make-Up, and General Considerations. These four topics are divided into several subheads.

If a paper gets above 950 points out of the possible 1000 points, it rates Medalist honor. This is the highest honor any paper can get.

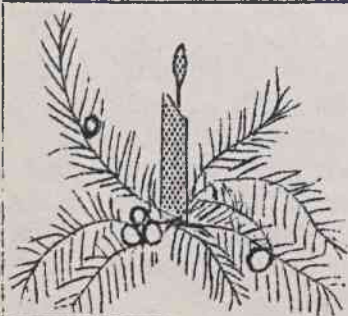
