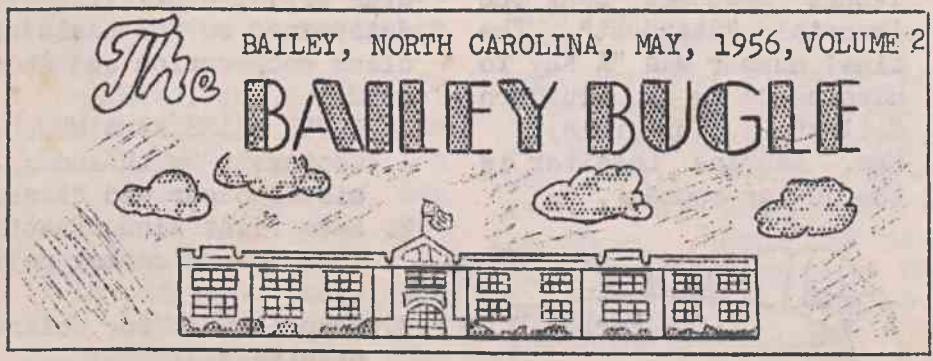
This is the first time a former graduate of Bailey High School has delivered the Baccalaureate Sermon.

Louise Wells, Jr. To Serve As Chief Marshal
