

Teachers Endeavor To Spur Increased Study Interest

To encourage day-by-day studying and to eliminate so many D's and Incompletes on report cards, the teachers formulated a few regulations that went into effect on November 2.

As a means of raising grades for the first six-week grading period, any student was given a chance to make up all back work by November 9.

RULES

A second rule requires work to be in within two days after a student returns to school if he has been absent only one or two days.


The decision reached by the faculty specifically states that hereafter a six-week grade will not be changed except in the case of sickness or other incident that causes a student to miss the last part of a grading period.

If a teacher announces a test before the date of the test, any student absent that day must make the test up the day he returns on a study hall before class, if one; if not, on class.

SEMESTER GRADES

At the end of a semester, if a student fails the exam, he may take the exam over once if passing is determined by exam.

"These added regulations are not intended as punishment. We hope that by observing them each student will keep both the quality and quantity of his work up to par," explains Principal M. W. Weaver.
