$3 \frac{1}{2}$-inch slices of white bread
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter or margarine
1 tablespoon minced pimento

Steps in preparation:

1. Trim crust off bread, keeping all slices the same size.
2. Cream butter until sof't; mince pimento and add to butter.
3. Spread two large "club" sandwiches with the mixture, one with white in the riddle and wholewheat on the outeide

4. Wrap in waxed paper and damp towel and chill for several hours.

7. Remove and cut checkerboards off in $\frac{1}{4}$-inch slices to serve.
