Principal Reporting

The percentage of graduates attending college varies widely in the counties North Carolina. The range in 1955 was from 7.6% to 48.1%. The state average was 31.3%. The class of 1956 of Bailey has 18% of its members taking higher training. The Nash County average for 1955 shows 31.3% of its white graduates and 34.1% of its Negro graduates attending college.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Scholastic Magazines have recently raised some questions about college attendance. Their recommendations are:

1. Start planning early-even as early as the

eighth grade.

2. Take "solid" subjects-English, math. science included. says, "Omit registrae the frills" and take the subjects which prepare for college".

3. Get good grades--most of the students rejected could have placed in the upper part of the class had they taken their high school work more seriously.

Just this week we have had a young man wanting to get into State College. He graduated without algebra geometry. He have taken both. Avoid the easy way out. You may decide on a college later.


