### Judging Contest Set For April 15

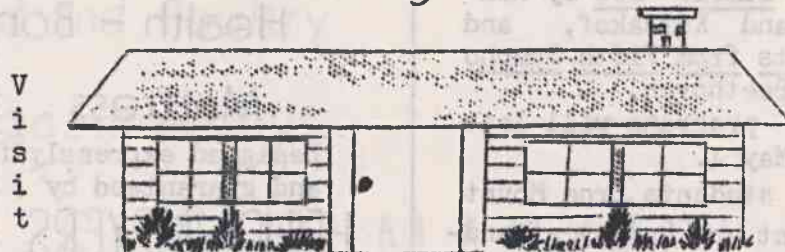
The annual Dairy Gattle, Beef Cattle, and Hog Judging Contests will take place in the Leggett community, April 15.
