

## NEW EQUIPMENT ADDED



This year, Bailey High has been fortunate enough to receive several new pieces of equipment for instruction, including audio-visual equipment and two new appliances for the Home Economics department.

### SOURCE

The main source of funds for these purchases was the National Defense Education Act. The NDEA is concerned with the teaching of mathematics, science, and modern languages.

### COST

The most expensive NDEA purchase was a new and much needed 16-mm. Special purpose projector, for \$364. This is used by the entire school for academic and documentary films. Along the same lines are two filmstrip viewers, much less expensive at \$20 each, but still very useful. A number of filmstrips, concerned for the most part with mathematics, were also purchased. A welcome addition to the math and science departments was a special typewriter, at \$135, with numerals, fractions, and sym-

bols as well as letters. The science department is making good use of its fine quality, powerful new Stereo microscope, and NDEA purchase for \$108. A tape recorder, for use in the teaching of foreign languages, was also bought.

### P. T. A. FUNDS

A part of the P. T. A. funds, obtained from the Halloween Carnival, was spent this year for a new Bohn Spirit Duplicator. This machine is useful to the entire faculty for running off tests, announcements, schedules, or anything requiring several copies. Also this year, two new appliances, a range and a refrigerator, were bought for the Home Economics department by the county.

All this new equipment will be used by the faculty to make learning a more exciting and vivid experience to students. A school that is well equipped with dedicated, responsible teachers and modern, effective teaching aids will provide a stimulating educational environment conducive to the growth of its students.
