Of Interclass Basketball

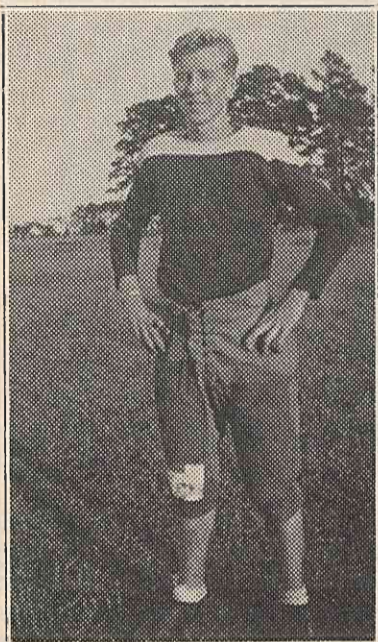
GHS is beginning its third consecutive year of interclass basketball for both boys and girls.

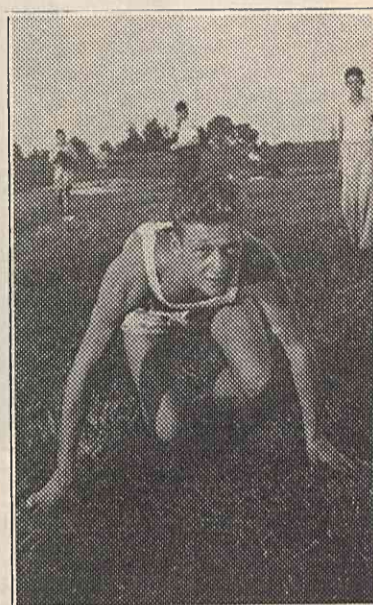
