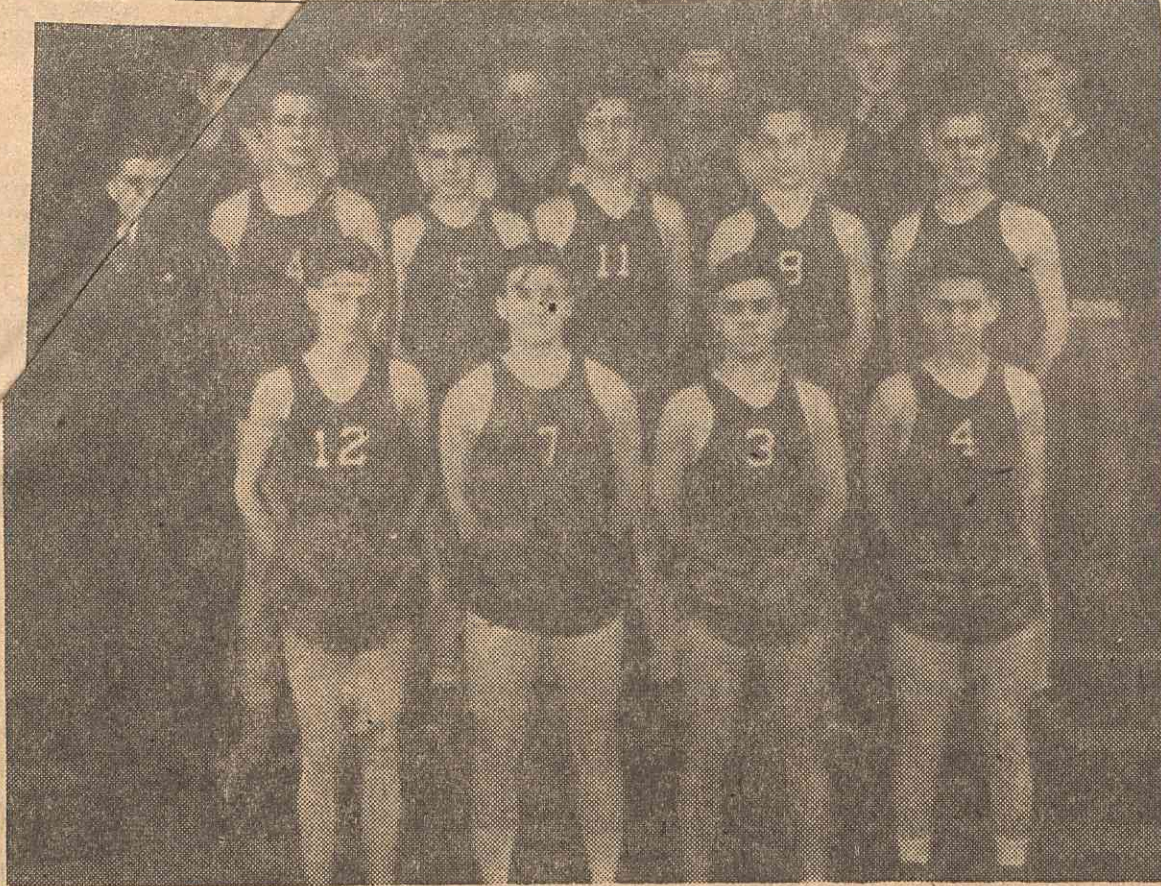
Sissies
