Coach Jeffrey has been coaching since 1933, since he was coach at Smithfield. Since then he has served as coach at Albemarle and Goldsboro.

His football record since that date consists of 83 wins as against 45 losses. His record in Goldsboro is 54 wins to 34 losses.

Now 38 years old, Coach received his master's degree in Physical Education in 1941, from the University of North Carolina. He graduated from State College in 1930 after winning 3 Varsity letters.

Among his records Coach holds 3 North Carolina Conference football championships in 1938, 1940, and 1944, and an undefeated season in 1937, and also a Class A basketball championship.
