
Lennon, Harrison, Starr; Is There A McCartney?

We were all surprised to hear the theme of Rocky Mount, North Carolina's Red Carpet City as sung by a top folk singing group and larger group from Norfolk, Va.



The entire student body of the new RMSH will be united at one assembly in the gym Tuesday, December 2.


