Gryphons Take Capital Series

In four games, Rocky Mount has had 51 hits, scored 39 runs, and is undefeated in opening play. The Gryphons have had good support from all of their starters. Rocky Mount has seven players batting over .300. Those players are Sonny Wooten, .333, Randy Warrick, .400, Mike Ruffin, .400, Pete Thompson, .500 and Dennis Pittman, .580. Larry Daughtridge of the pitching staff has had two hits in the games that he has played in. He is batting .667. Daughtridge has also struck out 23 batters in two games.

DEFEAT ENLOE

Rocky Mount began its season with a close 6-5 victory but had to fight for it all the way. Senior ace Charles Bell had pitch-

ing problems in the first inning and was relieved by Larry Daughtridge. Daughtridge struck out nine batters and won the game knocking in the winning run.

Mike Ruffin led Rocky Mount with two doubles and a single and Dennis Pittman had two doubles. Daughtridge had two doubles and three RBIs.

The Gryphons took their second game of the season with a 2-0 conquest of Raleigh Broughton at Municipal Stadium. Rocky Mount was never in trouble as senior Charles Bell led the way striking out eight batters and winning his first game with no losses.

the plate by Dennis Pittman with a triple and a single. Bell had two hits and sophomore Randy Warrick had two hits in three trips.
