## Southwest Gets a Scare Elizabeth MassingIII, Assistant Editor

Southwest Edgecombe High School in Pinetops, NC, has fallen into the Columbine-esque pattern of hit lists and arrests. Late Sunday night, February 24, a call was placed to the Edgecombe County sheriff's office from a concerned parent. Their child had told them about a possible hit list, plotted by two SEHS students. Following an investigation, at 3am Monday, the house of a 17-year-old SEHS female was searched, and the suspected hit list was found. Another suspect, a 15-year-old male from the school, was detained, while the female was taken in for questioning. The hit list included more than 20 people, including and students. The people on the hit list were informed, and a letter was sent home to parents on Monday. Law enforcement presence at Southwest was increased on Monday to make the students feel safer, but that presence was reduced by Tuesday. Tuesday, February 26, both students were charged with conspiracy to harm the students and teachers on the list. Ginger Adcock, a SEHS senior, was listed as a resident of Greenville, NC. Authorities believe that she was residing with relatives. The 15-year-old male was additionally charged with soliciting others to commit a crime with a deadly weapon. His name will not be released because of his status as a juvenile. Both of the student were expelled from the Edgecombe County school system, and will not be returning this year. Plans for the future education of these two youths is not definite as of the press deadline.
