


ELEVENTH GRADE GRADUATES

Enrollment Will Be Over 800 Next Year

School will open next year with an enrollment of 830 students, an increase of 185 over the present enrollment. The greatest increase will be in the freshman class with a total of 270 registered, as compared with the 175 freshmen this year.

The twelfth grade enrollment will increase from 33 to 42 students.
