deal,

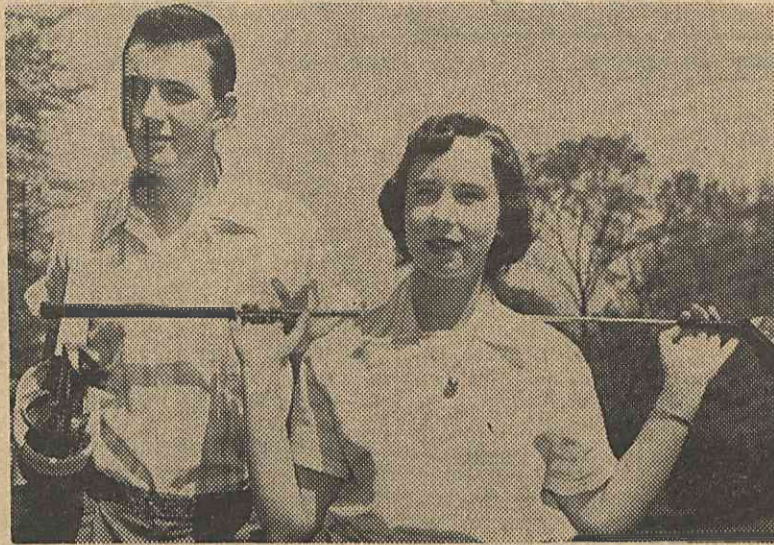
Or if your teacher tried to help
